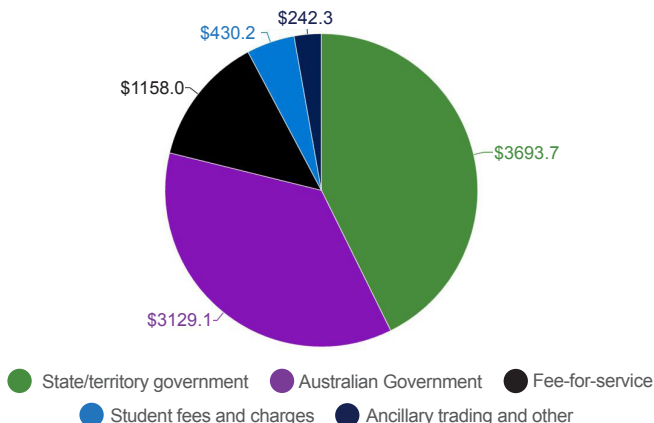

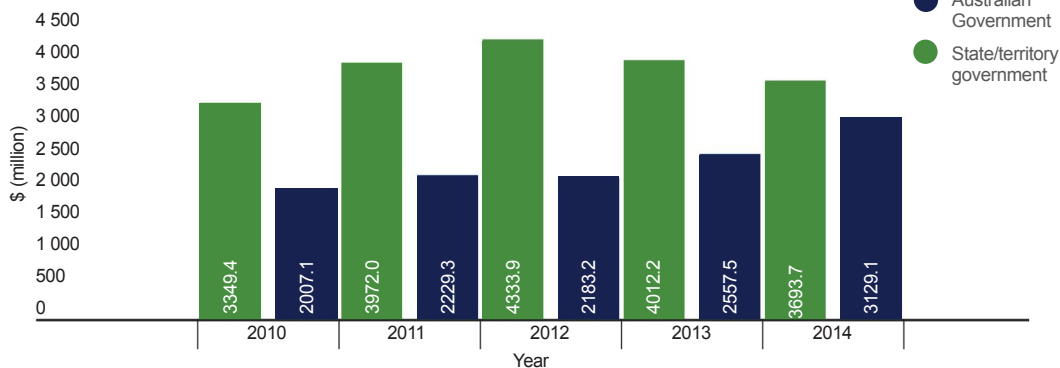

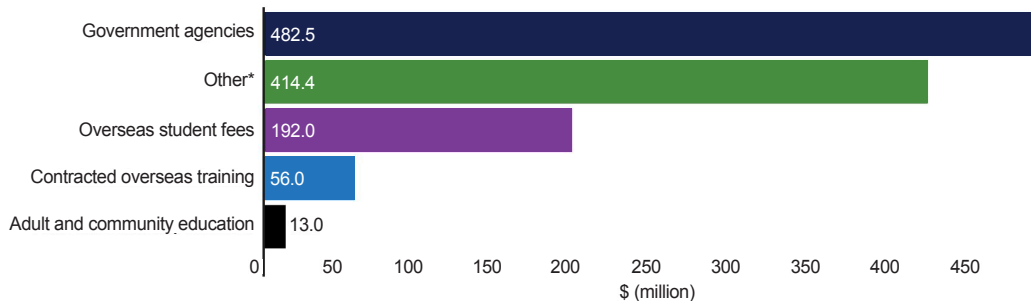
## Operating revenue by category 2014 (\$ million)



## Revenue from total government training departments

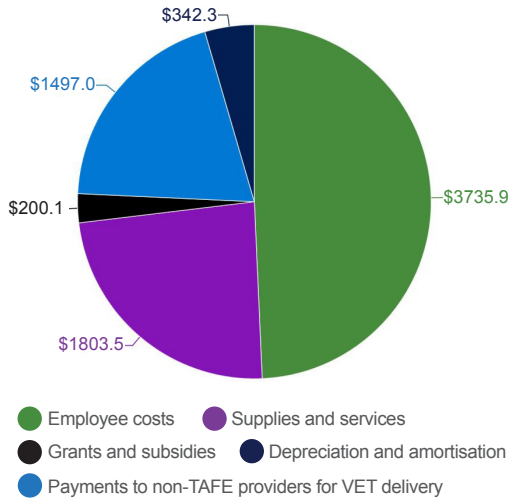


## Revenue category: fee-for-service 2014 (\$ million)

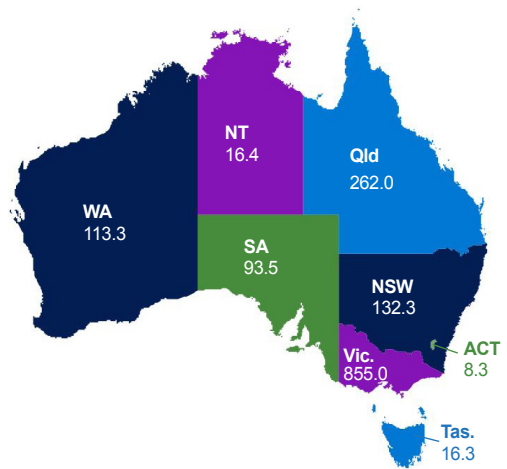

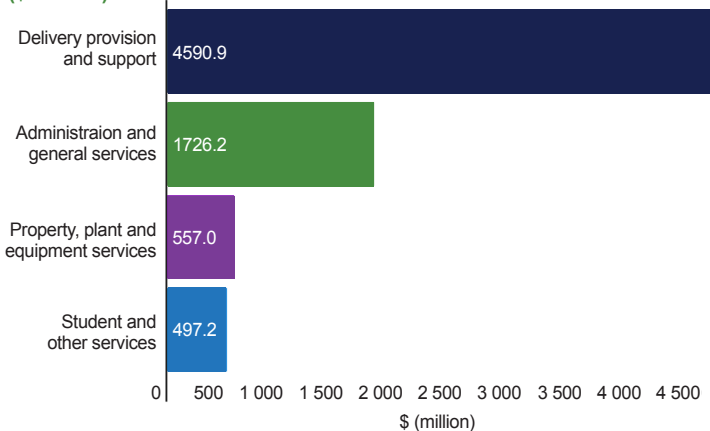
## Operating expenditure by category (\$ million)
