


This infographic provides a snapshot of graduate outcomes from Australia's government-funded vocational education and training (VET) sector for 2015, six months after training; and employers' use and views of the VET system in 2015. Government-funded VET is broadly defined as all activity delivered by government providers and government-funded activity delivered by community education and private training providers.

Government-funded student outcomes 2015

Over 65 000 students responded to the 2015 survey about employment outcomes, satisfaction with training and further study patterns.


Graduate destinations after training




Average salary of those employed full-time after training

Satisfaction and benefits of training

-  78.8% found the training relevant to their current job.
-  75.1% received at least one job-related benefit.
-  86.7% were satisfied with the overall quality of their training.
-  80.4% achieved their main reason for training.

Employers' use and views of the VET system in 2015

The Survey of Employers' Use and Views of the VET System surveys around 9000 employers from across the country and identifies the ways in which they meet their skill needs and the effectiveness of these strategies.




52.8% of employers use the VET system.



36.6% have jobs requiring vocational qualifications.



24.3% have apprentices or trainees.



20.6% provide employees with nationally recognised training.
